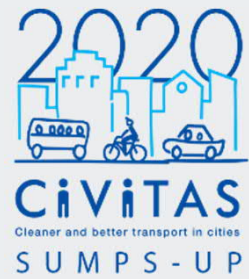

# About CIVITAS SUMP s-Up

## Objective

Enable mobility planning authorities across Europe to embrace SUMP as the European-wide strategic planning approach, especially where the take-up is low and the negative effects of transport are severe.



## Target

- 7 SUMP s-Up partner cities
- training for 100 cities
- capacity building for 200 mobility practitioners
- reach out to 600 authorities
- 30 SUMP s prepared

# SUMP Learning Programme (SLP)

- Participants learned and interacted with each other in varied ways, with a mix of online and face-to-face elements.
- The knowledge and input they provide also fed directly into the development of the tools and resources they will later use. All learning was participant-driven.

# Publications and reports



## Start - Beginner Cities

This offers examples and suggestions on conducting measure selection for a first SUMP, possible measures to consider, grading these measures, and gaining approval for their implementation.

## Step-up - Intermediate Cities

This gives advice on applying a more systematic approach to measure selection, finding synergies between different measure types and policy areas, and integrating measures from new fields into what has already been done in a city.

## Innovate - Advanced Cities

This focuses on finding ways to cooperate with stakeholders and the public and open up participation, approaches that help realise the implementation of new ideas, and devising strategies to foster innovation and reach beyond the transport sector.

# SUMP Self-assessment online tool



- helps cities to identify **strengths and weaknesses**
- provides **feedback and inspiration** how to improve mobility planning
- starts a discussion how to **improve cooperation** within the organization and with others
- online and **free to use** (no external auditor needed)
- **quick** and anonymous self-assessment (20min – 2h)

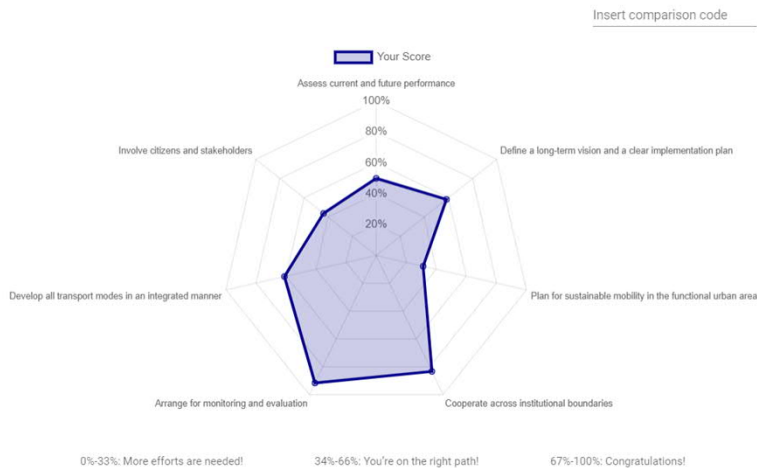
