What is the localisation of the SDGs?



Defining, implementing and monitoring strategies at the local level for achieving sustainable development goals at the global, national and subnational level. This involves concrete mechanisms, tools, innovations, platforms and processes to effectively translate the development agenda into results at the local level.

SDG awareness raising – VVSG Association of Flemish local authorities

• Develop an awareness raising campaign with the pilot municipalities to make the SDGs more visible within Flanders/Belgium and to attract media attention.

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Mapping – Milan, Italy

• The municipality approved a council decision to map every budget chapter according to the SDG targets.

• The city elaborated several documents to assess the priority SDGs, with a participatory approach and the partnership with stakeholders





Mapping – Gothenburg, Sweden

- The municipality commissioned an assessment of the SDGs in city plans to research consultants
- The report included:
 - analysis of the City's 2018 budget with regards to the SDGs
 - analysis of which SDG targets were relevant to the city (100 over 169)





Figure 1. Mapping of Gothenburg City's 2019 budget to the SDGs Source: SLK A2030 Team analysis. *Translated to English by author*

From national to local systems


- Global system

A Voluntary Local Review is a **tool** that **allows cities to assess the achievement of the SDGs**

"Local statistical capacities to collect data, monitor, evaluate, and engage in national SDG-related data efforts are critical elements of the successful implementation of the SDGs"

It supports to European cities willing to prepare their SDG Local Voluntary Reviews

It offers a framework for the selection of appropriate indicators to tailor the reviews to local context and to ensure comparability among cities.

The city started to elaborate the new strategic planned in 2019:

- SDG oriented assessment
- SDG clustering in main transitions
- Re conceptualization of development concept
